

Qualifications Noted for Board

(Editor's Note: Candidates in the April 20 election for three members of the Torrance Board of Education submitted the following answer; in response to a questionnaire prepared by the Torrance League of Women Voters.

To avoid unnecessary repetition of questions, the Press-Herald has grouped the answers by question, rather than by candidate. Neither the Press-Herald nor the League of Women Voters has made any changes in the candidate's reply.

Copies of the questionnaire are available in the public libraries.

Through special permission granted by the Torrance League of Women Voters, the Press-Herald today publishes answers to the second of the two questions submitted to the candidates.)

What personal or specific qualifications do you possess which would contribute to or enhance your effectiveness as a school board member?

Adolph Bialecki:
"My broad technical and research experience and my willingness to work with vigor qualify me. As engineer-scientist I planned research and priced costs of projects. I worked on scientific missions on the moon for the Apollo program and on life support systems for nuclear submarines and space ships, engineering economies. I taught college chemistry.

"My five children are daily reminders of educational needs and costs.

"I am able to think independently yet work with others. I sincerely want to serve on the School Board towards the community goal of quality education."

Joseph E. Bishop:
"As an accountant and tax advisor, I have knowledge of, and would investigate additional sources of funds which would benefit our school children. Education is the process of learning, and it is the duty of the School Board to educate itself in new ways and means of increasing revenue without taxation."

William A. Goodman:
"Academic preparation in Psychology and Education is an aid in seeing where action is necessary. Teaching experience at the Elementary level and having a Certificate to teach the elementary school level assures action on familiar territory. Past Secretary of the Torrance Education Association and member of California Teachers Association, the National Education

Association, and other professional groups assure professional standing. As a consultant to management, I am equipped to organize, plan, and carry out a plan of action."

William J. Hanson:
"I am an incumbent past President of the board with four years of constructive, progressive, economical service, and thoroughly familiar with the Torrance School District. My three children have been in every grade in our schools. Many of the changes I have initiated resulted from observing ways of improving my own children's education. Next, as a former teacher, I am better qualified to evaluate educational policies. Finally, as an industrial laboratory supervisor, I'm familiar with efficient, economical operations."

Bert M. Lynn:
"Firmly, I stand for local control and a strong lay Governing Board which sets your public school policies. Four years' experience on your School Board has included thousands of hours of study, meetings, research, symposiums and conferences on the financial and educational aspects of school districts. My resolution leads a state-wide crusade for the contribution of 'equal dollars' from the State to ease our local tax burden. For four years the parent-taxpayer voice has been heeded. My vote has shown consistency, integrity, conviction, business acumen and resourcefulness, making this candidate best able to serve you."

Virginia Miller:
"As the mother of two former students in the Torrance school district and the mother and grandmother of two who are in private school, because of the Torrance school district, I am committed to a sound education for all students. I have the courage of my convictions and the time to serve our students without favoritism."

Michael H. Moore:
"I am a parent, concerned about the quality of my children's education; I am a taxpayer, concerned about the depth of my pocketbook; and, I am a voter concerned about foresight, determination and mettle of our next School Board. To be concerned is paramount, and, with my business background and formal training to combine a watchful eye on our tax dollar with an ear tuned to more effective education, I believe I can best serve the interests of our children and community."
