While it is said that cats have nine lives, an Inglewood six-year-old named Mark Bregand, 340 W. Regent St., can claim that he is the proud claim that he is the proba-owner of two lives after In-glewood firemen gave him a new one when he fell in an unguarded swimming pool last month.

Two Inglewood firemen were able to give Mark his second life after using the techniques of closed chest cardiac resuscitation, learned at a special training session offered to Inglewood firemen last month by the Southwestern Branch of the Los Angeles County Heart Association

Thanks to their newly learned knowledge, taught to them by Dr. Walter L. Johnson of Inglewood, and Dr. Richard J. Lescoe, Torrance, Mark is able to live his second life.
