A Torrance elementary school vice principal has received his doctorate in education.

Frank Tyrrell, vice-principal of Fern - Greenwood School, was awarded his doctor's degree by the University of Southern California after completing his oral examination before a committee Monday.

A native of Detroit, Mich., Dr. Tyrrell completed undergraduate work at the University of Detroit and Long Beach State College. He holds a B.A. degree from Long Beach State and earned a master's degree at U.S.C.

County Dams To Install Alarm Device

Installation of electronic alarm devices on five County Flood Control District dams fronting on heavily populated areas has been approved by the Board of Supervisors.

The action was recommended by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn who asked for detailed studies on methods of improving the safety features of the county agency's 14 dams following the collapse of the Los Angeles City Department of Water and Power's Baldwin Hills Reservoir in December, 1963.

Plans call for installation of electronic devices at Big Tujunga, Pacoima, Santa Anita, San Dimas and Puddingstone Dams. These instruments would sound an alarm in the dam operator's residence should the dam's overflow at any time exceed a preset amount.

Present plans indicate the program will be fully operational by the winter of 1965-66.

Married to a lifelong Torrance resident, the former Barbara Calvey, Dr. Tyrrell resides at 22629 Greenwood St. and is the father of five children, Steven, 8; Carrie, 6; Lisa, 4; Jennifer, 2; and John, 1.
