### Area Chambers Invited to Join Local Military Affairs Group

The Military Affairs Committee of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce is inviting area chambers of commerce to participate in its regular quarterly meetings, according to George S. Wing, chairman.

The committee was organized last year to establish a better relationship between the military services and the business community.

"We believe this endeavor will be more effective and advantageous to military committee members if other area chambers of commerce participate in the program," Wing stated.

IN MAKING the announcement, Wing outlined the objectives of the committee as follows:

- Devote time and resources to the maintaining of a liaison with all military organizations and rendering all assistance where possible.

- Support on the basis of positive, competitive advantages the awarding of appropriate military contracts to Torrance area industries.

- Keep informed of all legislation affecting, in particular, the local military establishment from an economic and morale standpoint; to make recommendations to the Board of Directors of the Chamber for action on such legislation; and to receive comments by military officials having a ninterest in such legislation.

- CREATE consolidated community support behind Torrance Chamber of Com-

merce endorsed military projects and proposals through liaison efforts with other local agencies and groups whose interest and assistance dictate the accomplishment of these projects.

- Provide speaking platforms for key military officials who wish to address area civilian and business groups; plan seminars or other events to hear reports on military or defense-related subjects of interest to local businessmen and citizens.

- Plan and/or coordinate visits open to the Chamber membership to area military installations, defense plants or other facilities or special out-of-area events.

- Lend active support to the community's annual Armed Forces Day observance.
