### Five-Year-Olds Take First Step to School

More than 3,000 youngsters are taking first steps this month towards swapping the carefree life of the nursery years for the grownup world of school.

Although they won't be starting school until fall, the 1965 crop of five-year-olds is previewing its change in status at kindergarten roundups currently under way at 33 district elementary schools.

Introducing pre-kindergartners to their first glimpse of school life are three persons destined to play an active part in the first nine years of their academic life: the school nurse, the school secretary, and the principal.

### Instructor Is Pioneer In Field

Very few people have the opportunity to be pioneers in their fields. Yet Theodore Thomas, instructor of technical illustration at El Camino College, has done just that.

Five years ago, Thomas wrote the first book ever published about technical illustration. Last month, he completed his second education publication entitled, "Technical Illustration, Technique Study Guide Workbook."

The essence of technical illustration is the drawing of objects in three-dimension. The importance of the subject emerged in the second World War, when many unskilled workers were needed to read blueprints. After the war, there was little advance in technical illustration but during the past five years the commercial phase of this field had grown rapidly because it is essential in the designing, manufacturing, selling or repairing of any object.

THOMAS, WHO has taught for eleven years at El Camino, began drafting and technical drawing while in high school in Northern New Mexico. He now holds a BA degree from Black Hills State Teachers College in South Dakota and a MA degree from Colorado State University. He is presently working on his PhD at Colorado State College.

Thomas will teach a seminar-workshop at Arizona State College this summer to assist high school and college instructors in beginning courses in the field in their respective schools.

Thomas' writing career will not end with the completion of his workbook. He plans to revise his original textbook because of constant changes occurring in the area of technical illustration. In addition, he has written articles for "School Shop Magazine" and "Graphic Science." Plans for future books are included on his personal agenda.
