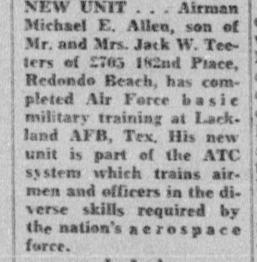
His promotion was based on time in service and rank, military appearance, and his knowledge of selected military subjects.
