Residents Circulate Petition

A petition requesting the County Board of Supervisors annex three tracts in the Carson area to Lighting Maintenance District 1670 for the purpose of installing street lights is in circulation.

The remaining members of the class who have not as yet been accepted are still waiting to be notified, but there is every reason to believe

that the majority of them will be accepted. All are eligible for enrollment in state colleges."
