# Youngsters Help Polish Uncle's Tarnished Image

Can the youth of America give a giant purpose to the nation, and restore Uncle Sam's tarnished

image abroad? Gold Medalists John Sayre and Richard "Rusty" Wailes, advisors to the U.S. Olympic team at Tokyo and two of the country's rowing greats, answer with a ringing "Yes"

Just returned from a two-month tour in which they visited 60 campuses and addressed 30,000 university and high school students from Florida to Oregon, Sayre and Wailes are meeting at Moral Re-Armament's West Coast headquarters with student leaders from the Los Angeles, Indio, Riverside, Santa Barbara, Redding and Santa Rosa areas in preparation for a conference of 10,000 youth for "Modernizing America" at Mackinac Island, Mich., this summer.

With them were the Colwell Brothers, musical trio from San Marino, who after singing in 37 countries—

27 heads of state and prime ministers and in 48 languages—are back in California for the first time in 10 years.

"American youth," say Sayre and Wailes, "with an aim to match the hour, can be our country's best ambassadors. The tremendous response we met with across the country shows they can win and enlist millions of young men and women, on both sides of the Iron Curtain, who are in rebellion against the failures and double standards of the older generation, but who have no cure for what is wrong with themselves."

The Newsletter of the U.S. Olympic Committee, issued at Olympic House, New York, recently paid tribute to the two American oarsmen, stating that the counseling service they provided on the responsibilities of American ath-

letes abroad was "one of the great contributions to the Tokyo success story." It calls special attention to their impact on the Soviet team.

Sayre stroked the championship four-oared crew at Rome in 1960, and Wailes, a former Yale Varsity captain, was No. 3 in the same boat. Between them they have won five gold medals. The two are co-directors of the Mackinac Conference.

The purpose of Mackinac, say the two athletes, is "to raise a force of youth trained in the moral disciplines and purposes of free democracy, and capable of providing in the life of nations, and in any threatened area, a focus for unity, and a dynamic alternative to totalitarianism of right or left."

"The world is waiting to see if this country can pro-

duce a new breed of American, trained not only in the technical know-how of an atomic age, but also in the character-toughening, problem-solving, nation-saving skills that age demands."

"Young Americans," they added, "are at this moment giving their lives with incredible valor in the jungles of Vietnam. We must train them to extend freedom in the war of ideas as well as to defend it in the war of arms. They deserve to be equipped not only with the most sophisticated weaponry, but also with an ideology that can demonstrate to Peking, Moscow and Havana a new way to go."

The conference at Mackinac Island, embracing four 3-week sessions from June 14 to Sept. 4, also will be

attended by youth delegates from India, Japan, Europe, Africa and Latin America.
