## Carpentry, Architecture Classes Construct House on ECC Campus

The eighth student constructed family residence has been completed at El Camino College.

More than 50 students from classes in architectural drafting carpentry, heating and air conditioning, and home economics took part in the construction.

Initial work on the home began in the fall of 1963 and was completed this spring. At present, students are working on a ninth home to be com-pleted this fall.

The home measures 1,200 square feet and includes three bedrooms and a bath and a half. Other features are hardwood cabinets and slab doors, a stained-glass entry door, all-aluminum sash and sliding doors, vinyl-tile floors and nylon carpeting in the living-room, hall and entry.

INCLUDED IN the kitchen INCLUDED IN the kitchen area is a built-in range, oven and hood with fan and light, disposal, large closets and laundry room for automatic washer and dryer, formica counter-tops and an adjacent dining section.

Other features are electric

Other features are electric wiring in flexible conduit, convenient telephone and TV outlets, rock roofing, a 10-year glass-lined water heater and a forced-air furnace.

and drawing of working plans, the pouring of foundation, and the construction of exterior and interior walls, to the selection of colors and fabrics for interior decora-tions, was the work of classes in four different instruction al areas

Coordination for the projects centered around the advanced carpentry classes of instructor Ken Dutro. His students selected a general architectural plan which they submitted to Albert Palmer, drafting instructor. drafting instructor.

PALMER EXPLAINED the project to his students and opened the assignment to vol-unteers. Designer-draftsman for the home was Roger K.
Clute, who assumed the responsibility of revising the
original plan and submitting preliminary drawings to car-

pentry.
Clute also had the responsi-Clute also had the responsibility of building a complete and accurate scale model of the home. The model, in turn, was given to the home economics department, where it was used by students planning interior decoration.

Actual construction on the project was begun by the carpentry classes. The men poured the foundation, laid the

flooring and erected the frame. The only phase of con-struction not done by the stu-dents was the plumbing, rock-roofing and laying of

rock-roofing and laying of carpets.

Coordinated with the carpentry was the heating and air conditioning work done by vocational students under the direction of instructor Carlton Ricker.

The students' job was to determine the heat load the house would require and estimate the size of coil needed for both heating and air conditioning. Students also laid out and inserted the duct work for the house. work for the house.

WITH THE HEATING in, WITH THE HEATING in, the tiles set and the roof on, the remainder of the work was turned over to the ladies. Their primary concerns were color, fabric and texture of interior walls and floor coverings. These decisions were made by students of Mrs. Hazel Kuehn's home economics classes.

For the El Camino home, For the El Camino home, the students chose beiges and soft browns and complimentary hues of orange to give warmth. In fabrics they selected dull textured and matted surfaces, rather than shiny materials in an effort to soften the appearance of the rooms.
