Voters Okay Use of Gas In Viet Nam

Use of nonlethal gas in South Viet Nam was approved by nearly half of the first 10,000 persons replying to a question on the subject, Congressman Alphonzo Bell (R-Calif.) reported this week.

One of six questions asked of voters in his 28th Congressional District, the use of

sional District, the use of nonlethal gas was approved by 47 per cent of those re-plying while it was disap-proved only by 41 per cent. Another 12 per cent were un-decided.

ON OTHER questions, per cent supported legisla-tion to restrict mail-order tion to restrict mail-order sale of firearms; 64 per cent thought the government should encourage arrangement of a negotiated settlement in Viet Nam; and 71 per cent thought Secretary of Labor Wirtz should permit use of braceros in California. Voters opposed two other suggestions when queried by the Congressman. Only 42 per cent of those answering supported formation of a De-

per cent of those answering supported formation of a Department of Housing and Urban Development while 45 per cent opposed such a plan. On the matter of expanding trade between the United States and Soviet satellites, 57 per cent of those answering Congressman Bell's questionnaire opposed while only onnaire opposed while only 84 per cent agreed.


