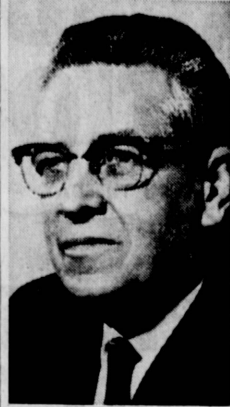


Francis Derouin, Local Resident, Dies Suddenly

Francis A. Derouin, resident of 1643 W. 254th St., Harbor City, died suddenly at his home Monday afternoon, after a four-year illness.

He was a native of Gently, Minn., where he was born in April 23, 1904. He was married to the former Ella Capistran on Feb. 8, 1934, at St. Ann's church in Crookston, Minn. He and his family moved to Torrance in 1939 and to Harbor City in 1942. He was formerly employed by Columbia Steel and Consolidated Shipyards before his association in 1945 with the Derouin Brothers Furniture Frame Mfg., which was first located at 1917 Torrance Blvd., and in 1960 moved to 221 E. D St. in Wilmington.

He was a charter member of St. Gerards Knights of Columbus 4919, Torrance and was instrumental in its institution. He was also a former member of the Holy Name Society of Nativity Parish in Torrance and presently of St. Margaret Mary's in Lomita. He is survived by his widow, Ella; three daughters, Catherine Ann of the home

Rosary will be recited in St. Margaret Mary's Church, Lomita, at 8 this evening. Requiem mass will be celebrated at the church Thursday morning at 9 with the Rev. Father John Hegarty officiating.

(Continued from Page 1) fines, charges for such services as trash collection and water, and airport fees will provide the remainder of the funds. In addition, nearly \$650,000 in surplus funds is included in the new budget.

After adopting the budget, councilmen voted to delete a proposed Japanese garden and a park nursery and storage area from the 1965-66 capital improvements program. Cost of the two projects was estimated at \$44,900.

The council also instructed Ferraro to review the capital improvements program after the city's assessed valuation is determined. He will submit a report on his survey by Oct. 1.

• Voted to remove stop signs on Prairie Avenue at 176th Street. A crossing guard will be provided at the intersection for school children who must cross Prairie Avenue to get to Perry School.

• Voted to remove stop signs on Carson Street at Fern Avenue. A crossing guard already is on duty at the intersection.

• Approved the installation of stop signs on Entradero Avenue at Towers Street.

• Approved the use of the Park and Recreational Facilities Fund and the Building Reserve in the Parks, Playgrounds, and Recreation Center Fund for pending capital improvements in the city's parks.
