A profusion of hydrangeas, in the pastel shades, were used in decorating for the party.

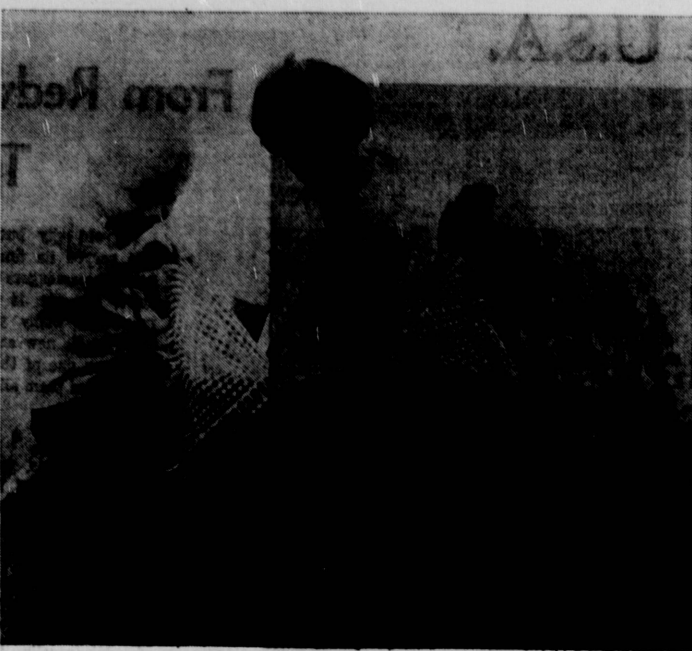
The bride's long-time friends of the Loranger family, were seated at a lunch-

## Harbor Banking Chapter To Host District Meet

On Saturday, July 10, the 1532 members of the local Harbor District Chapter of the American Institute of Banking will host the 400 delegates of District VII at the Institute's 31st annual Regional Conference, according to Dean Andreasen, Harbor Chapter president and a department head at the Bank of America. Delegates to the conference will represent AIB chapters from all over Southern California, Hawaii and Arizona.

Other speakers will be Wallace Jamie, director of public relations for the Carnation Company, and Stary Grange, a farmer and former banker who is now special consultant to the Southern California Gas Co.

The American Institute of Banking is the educational section of the American Banking Association, and is the largest educational organization of its type in the world. With chapters and study groups in 571 cities and towns throughout the United States, its membership includes over 200,000 bank employees and officers. Some 30 courses of study are available to bankers through the Institute's educational program, and certificates are annually awarded to thousands of bankers for the successful completion of its prescribed courses.

During the school year just completed, the Harbor District Chapter honored 42 of its banker-students with certificates. Regional conferences of the type to be held at the Edgewater Hotel on July 10 serve as clearing houses for the discussion and solution of mutual banking educational problems.
