I wish to take this oppor tunity to thank you for your tremendous cooperation in publicizing our glaucoma clinic, which was held 10 June 1965.

I have just heard from Mr. Earl Mason, zone chair-man of the Lions International. His zone is comprised of all clubs in the general South Bay area, and we are tremendously pleased with what was accomplished on that clinic night. The following rundown rather indicates that we did definitely rend-er a fine public service, with which we are very happy, as naturally Lions Internation-al have always emphasized sight conservation. In Manhattan Beach, we

examined 120 persons and found seven elevations; in Redondo Beach, 210 exam-inations and 11 elevation findings; in Gardena, 261 ex-minations and 11 elevation aminations and nine eleva tion findings; in Hollypark, 163 examinations and five elevation findings, and in North Redondo, 29 examinations with two elevation find-

tions with two elevation find-ings. The fact that 34 p e o p le were found to have eleva-tion of pressure indicates that they are glaucoma-sus-pect, and because of this ex-mination we have recom-mended that these people contact their own physician or opthalmologist as soon as possible, so that, if the re-quirement is there, arrest of the disease can be made in the disease can be disease can be disease in the disease can be disease can be disea

made by specialists. I feel that if this information that if this information could be given to the public it might make more people aware of the fact that they, too, could become involved, and would make them desir-ous of wanting an annual checkup of their eyes.



minimum rates in the hauling of general commodities, it was reported today. The fine must be paid by Aug. 8. The commission found aft-er public hearing in Torrance that Walters assessed rates re-sulting in undercharges total-ing \$718.52. He was ordered to collect the undercharges from shippers and to examine

to collect the undercharges from shippers and to examine his records back to Aug. 1. 1962, and collect any other undercharges that may have occurred since than. Minimum rates are set by the commission according to law to prevent discriminatory charges for hauling, to stabi-lize the for-hire trucking in-dustry and to assure the pub-lic adequate and dependable service.


