## Garden Checklist

1. This is the best time to plant, transplant, or separate bamboo. To give the plants a good start, ix peat moss and ground bark into the soil where they are to grow.

2. Water camellias frequently and keep a 2inch mulch over the root area. Feed with acid fertillizer if you haven't done so since the plants have finished flowering. You can make tall, rangy plants more compact by pruning now.

3. Don't forget to set out chrysanthemums

this month in deep, rich soil and keep them fed, watered and pinched back for spectatular bloom.

4. Nurseries have a good selection of geraniums and pelargoniums now for bright spashes of instant color to replace spring bulbs.

Your nursery has an enormous selection of fine young plants, ready for potting or setting in the garden in shady spots. When planting, use 1/3 soil, 1/3 leafmold, 1/3 well rotted steer manure or a good commer cial planting mix. Pinch out the tips to force sich branches for heavy summer blaces. branches for heavy summer bloom.
