Women's Society of Christian Service of the First Methodist Church entertained at a luncheon Thursday at the Plush Pony restaurant honoring the Society's past presidents.

The guests of honor in-cluded a group of women who have long been identified with the civic and social life of the community, as well as the development of their church.

Among those being honored was Mrs. John Keefer, who served as WSCS president 1931-33, Mrs. Keefer came to Torrance in July 1928 and joined the church in September of that year. She taught Sunday school and held offices in the society which was then known and need offices in the so-ciety which was then known as the Ladies Aid. Torrance had a population of 6,000 at that time. Mrs. Keefer is the mother of one son, Bill, who is a Colonel in the Strategic Air Command.

Mrs. Mervin Schwab, whose term was 1950-51, came to Torrance in 1948 and has been active in the church since that time. She is the mother of Neil Schwab, and also has two grandchildren.

Serving as WSCS president 1953 to 1955, Mrs. John S. McMullen became a member of the local church in 1931. Besides her WSCS work, she has served on the Finance Commission, Sanctuary Committee and Board of Trustees. She is the mo-ther of Mrs. Jack Baker of

Mrs. C. P. Olson, who with her husband has lived in Leisure World since 1962,

served as leader of the WSCS from 1955-58. Mrs. Olson, who also served on the Sanctuary Committee, has a married son living in

Since 1940, Mrs. Harlan McCool has been active in WSCS, serving as president in 1958-1960. She is presently secretary of Spiritual Life of the WSCS and is secretary for the board and financial secretary of the church. She is the mother of 17-year-old Roger McCool.

Mrs. Carl Kildoo, Jr., immediate past president, serving 1963-64, came to Torrance in 1959. She has served as circle chairman, Secretary of Supply and is presently Circle Coordinator, and church treasurer. She has taught in the church and Bible schools. Mrs. Kildoo has one son.

Three past presidents, un-able to attend the luncheon in their honor, were Mmes. A. E. Palmer, William Speck,

and Russell Paxton.

Mrs. Palmer served as WSCS president from 1944 to 1949. She has two children, a daughter in Castro Valley and a son in Trona. Mrs. Palmer has served as chairman of the Finance chairman of the Finance Commission and on the Pas-toral Relations Commission.

Mrs. Paxton came to Torrance in 1941, joining the church at that time.
