Youth Corps Jobs Now Ready at Local Office

Jobs in the Neighborhood Youth Corps' out-of-school program are ready and waiting at the California State Employment Services office, 1016 Sartori St.

The Neighborhood Youth Corps is part of the anti-poverty program directed by the Youth Opportunities Board; it should not be confused with summer-time employment for teenagers. NYC's aim is primarily to help high school dropouts, aged 16 through 21, gain work experience so they can either support themselves and return to adult school to complete their education, or to help them move on to jobs beyond the menial unskilled level.

Trainees work 2 1/2 hours per week at \$1.27 per hour for a six-month period. They are not paid by the agencies employing them, but by the Labor Department through the Youth Opportunity Board.

NYC officials have worked out nine broad job classifications for trainees. Fields are clerical, program aides, admissions work, laboratory aides, dental assistant, publicity aides, nurses aides, maintenance aides, and groundsman-gardner.

Proof of age is required at the time of application.

Planetarium Show Takes Viewers to Moon, Titan

Interplanetary space-travel is visualized in "A Trip to the Moon and Saturn," now being shown at Griffith Park Observatory's planetarium theater, according to the Los Angeles City Recreation and Parks Department.

Open every day of the week through Sept. 12, the scientific center's planetarium theater schedules shows at 1:30, 8 and 9:30 p.m. daily. Extra shows are offered at 1:30 and 4:30 p.m. on weekends, according to Dr. Clarence H. Clemmshaw, Observatory director.

Planetarium audiences are enrolled as passengers on a simulated space vehicle and given an indoctrination talk on space travel. They then take off by rocket for the moon. When within a few hundred miles of that satellite, they hover and examine the surface through the eye of the Ranger 9 camera before landing.

THE LUNAR landscape of deep craters and towering cliffs is visualized by projecting the paintings of Chesley Bonestell on the theater's 75-foot domed ceiling. From here the sky is black and the earth a larger moon.

A different kind of satellite, Titan, the largest moon of Saturn, is selected for the second stage of the journey through space. Titan has the specific gravity needed to retain an atmosphere, and therefore has blue skies, like the earth.

ADMISSION to the unique theater is 75 cents for adults and 30 cents for children 5 to 18 years of age.

The Observatory's Hall of Science offers the curious a rare opportunity to operate various scientific apparatus, including a telescope, a submarine periscope, and various experiments demonstrating the nature of light and energy. The hall is open free to the public from 2 until 10 p.m. weekdays and weekends from 1 to 10 p.m.

Water Line to Be Relocated

The county will begin its improvement and widening of Carson Street between Normandie and the Harbor Freeway as quickly as the water company moves the lines, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.
