Garden Checklist

 Keep up your regular watering schedule, eing sure to soak deep. Daily watering of camel-as, other moisture-loving plants may be necessary. Don't neglect hanging baskets.

2. Cut back chrysanthemums to one foot now,

to keep them from getting too tall. Do not pinch later than the end of this month though, as this would remove flower buds. New chrysanthemum plants are still available at nurseries and if planted now will bloom on schedule.

3. Coming into flower this month is the showy Butterfly Bush, fine for cut flowers. You can choose this deciduous shrub with fragrant pink, blue, red, white or lilac flowers that will keep ming until October. It's a vigorous grower and not fussy about soil.

4. Plant fall vegetables such as snap beans, corn, carrots, lettuce and beets.

5. Fall blooming bulbs to set out now include Autumn Crocus, cyclamen, Sternbergia, and Zephyr Lfly.

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
