Sulky Gets Itchy Feet

Art Craig, a slender, handsome young man of 23 is a person with itchy feet. "I could never stay in one place too long," he says.

Today, those itchy feet are carrying Craig along a successful path that seems destined to lead him to the top in harness racing, a game that traditionally has been run by men twice his age.

Young Mr. Craig currently is training his first public stable, after a seven-year apprenticeship with one of the sport's masters, Joe O'Brien. "I quit school after the 11th grade and came to California in the fall of 1959. Luckily, I caught on as a groom with O'Brien and stayed with him for four years."

Art, who comes from a family that operates a mink ranch in Vancouver, B.C., tells an interesting story about his introduction to harness horses.

"I was riding show horses from the time I was about eight and one day I was walking through the stable area at a small Vancouver track and saw some harness horses. I said to a friend, 'Some day I'd sure like to get up behind one of those.'"

"Well, a second later this guy comes out of a stall and tells me, 'You can. Come by the barn next Saturday and I'll let you jog one of mine. I was at the barn every Saturday after that.'"

Craig finally got a chance to drive competitively last summer in Chicago, and won the first race of his career with a horse called Scotch Talent.

At Santa Anita this winter, where he has a five-horse stable for Ann Zaza, Craig has registered three winners, his first three in Western Harness annals.

Unless Lefty Dave LaRoche can stymie El Segundo High tomorrow, the Pioneer League baseball race will be pretty well settled.

In their first meeting of the year yesterday, Kemer Brett pitched a 5-hit 3-0 shutout over West's Warriors at El Segundo Recreation Park.

The rematch tomorrow will be at West, scene of last year's 5-0 one-hitter by LaRoche against the defending champions.

Brett, who also beat West 13-0 once last year, tamed the Warriors with a five-hitter in leading 'Gundo to its seventh straight league win.

Brett got the only run he needed in the fourth frame on a double steal. El Segundo got two insurance runs in the sixth inning to wreck Ron Sells' pitching effort.

Sells had the Eagles well checked until Ed Hora singled past first baseman LaRoche with two away in the fourth. He had Bob Mailor struck out to end the inning, but the ball got away from Catcher Allan Coward. Mailor reached first and Hora got around to third on the play.

On the next pitch Mailor headed for second, but help up between bases to allow Hora a chance to come home. The relay from Coward to Gary Swanson to the plate was late.

Steve Hunley led off the sixth with a single and Hora followed with a double. After LaRoche handled Mailor's grounder, Ron Green was walked to load the bases and Dana Pagett singled on the rightfield foul line.

Hora scored on Jerry Filson's sacrifice fly.

West got a threat going in the seventh with two away when Coward and Jim Barnes singled and Swanson walked, but LaRoche fanned to end the game.

Swanson got two of the five hits and walked twice against Brett.

Only in the fourth inning did West get anybody else as far as second base.

Mailor, playing in rightfield for the Eagles, grabbed three drives at the baseline by Barnes, LaRoche and Paul Gadbois.

Brett was credited with a triple on a high popper that fell at the baseline.

Brett had eight strikeouts to three for Sells.

Victories by Lennox and Lawndale widened the gap between El Segundo and the rest of the league by four games.

Lawndale downed Aviation, 4-1, and Lennox topped Palos Verdes, 4-1.
