

Meeting Slated by Colleges

"The Impact of Federal Legislation on the Junior College" will be theme of the spring meeting of the California Junior College Association, to be held at Harbor College Saturday.

Mrs. Grace Edwards, technical arts instructor, and Wallace Cohen, dean of the social science division, will represent El Camino College at the meeting. Dr. Jack Martin of El Camino currently is serving as the executive secretary of the organization.

Mrs. June Nelson, a music instructor at El Camino, will participate on a panel which will discuss the Re-Evaluation of the Requirements for Keyboard Skills for Music Majors.

Dr. Thomas B. Merson, director of research for the association, will discuss the effects of federal legislation on the junior college at the general session.

Customers will have a wide variety of flexible credit plans available at the Park Plaza store, including the newest instant credit plan offered by Newberry stores. A regular 30-day charge account, or flexible accounts accounts tailored to individual needs will be available. In addition, the new store will offer credit coupon books which may be used as cash in any Newberry store.

DEPARTMENTS in the new store will offer clothing for every member of the family, home furnishings, housewares, cameras and photographic equipment, yard goods and draperies, toys, a modern pet shop, outdoor shop, appliances, garden supplies and plants, phonograph records, and a huge infants' department.

The store has been planned and designed with an eye to customer convenience and eye appeal. Many new and convenient techniques in merchandise displays have been

included. Hours are 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays.

The J. J. Newberry Co., headquartered in New York, is headed by W. C. Straus, a veteran of many years with the firm. Divisional offices are located in Los Angeles, Boston, St. Louis, and Omaha, Neb.

For the past 10 years he has taught history and government at North High School and previously taught at Roosevelt Junior High School in Compton.


Two Youths Appointed To Academy
