Montgomery Wins, 4-3

Rallying for two runs in the sixth and seventh innings, Bishop Montgomery defeated Crespi, 4-3, in a crucial Camino Real League ball game Friday on the loser's field. Both finished the first round with 4-1 records.

Tom Thomsen was the pitching hero in relief. He took over for Irl Davis to

start the fifth inning, trailing 3-0, and slammed the door on the Celts while the Knights got busy and scored their four runs.

Crespi's 13-game win streak was wrecked in the 7th when the Knights jumped on Dave Sehnem for a triple, two doubles and single. Although Doug Jarvis led off with the

triple, it was Daryl Mickelbury's double, Chuck Bongard's single, and another double by Dan Pritchett that won the game.

In the sixth Pritchett also doubled, Danny Graham tripled, and Irl Davis' third hit of the game scored him. Davis gave up three earned runs in the third and fourth

innings before giving way to Thomsen. He gave up a walk, single and triple to Bill Smith, two runs in the third and Brian Porter singled home Joe Loll in the fourth.

Crespi got two aboard in the bottom of the 7th before Thomsen fanned Sehnem to end the game.

Montgomery's 10 hits in-

cluded two by Bongard, Pritchett and Graham and three by Davis.

As a team the Saxons clubbed three pitchers for 12 hits. Mike McCormick finished it off with a lofty home run to deep centerfield at the North "cow pasture."
