## Customers Now Make One Call

"A 'one-stop service' plan for telephone customers on the move has been put into effect throughout the nation, according to Jim Leggett, local manager of Pacific Telephone.

Customers now need to make only one call to disconnect their present service and arrange for service at their new location.

This arrangement means customers no longer have to make separate calls to disconnect telephones at one place and install them at a new address, Leggett explained.

When a customer is moving from Torrance to San Francisco, for example, the business office in Torrance will offer the customer the "easy move plan" when he requests his service to be discontinued. If the customer accepts the plan, his new address will be called to the business office in San Francisco. The office there will phone the customer to complete his request for telephone service.

Leggett said the plan, designed to provide complete and personalized telephone service for customers throughout the Bell System, has been in effect in Pacific Telephone for a year.

It was prompted, in part, by studies showing an estimated 35 million Americans change their residences each year. Of those, about 6 1/2 million move from one state to another.
