## Two Races Featured Saturday

Another outstanding quarter horse racing program is on tap this week as Los Alamitos winds up the third week of racing with the co-featured \$5,000 Chicado V. and \$5,000 Jet Deck highlighting Saturday's card.

The Chicado V., a 400-yard event for the three-year-olds and older stakes stars, will be the final prep for the \$35,000 Spring Championship a week from Saturday, May 7.

Some of the nation's top three-year-olds which competed in last week's \$50,000 Los Alamitos Derby will tangle with the older handicapped horses in the Chicado V. Among the sophomores slated to go in the race are Miss Gold Angel, Connie Reb, Go Rebel Go, Moore Go and Osage Lamb, while from the older ranks expected to battle the younger ones are Duplicate Copy, Go Jesie Go, Decketta and Joe Sherry.

The Chicado V. was started in 1960, but was not raced during the 1964 and 1965 meetings. Breeze Bar holds the race record for the event when she raced the 400-yard distance in 19.9 seconds in the 1961 edition, that clocking being a world record at the time.

The 1966 regular season will start May 4 at 5:30 p.m. at Ryan Field.

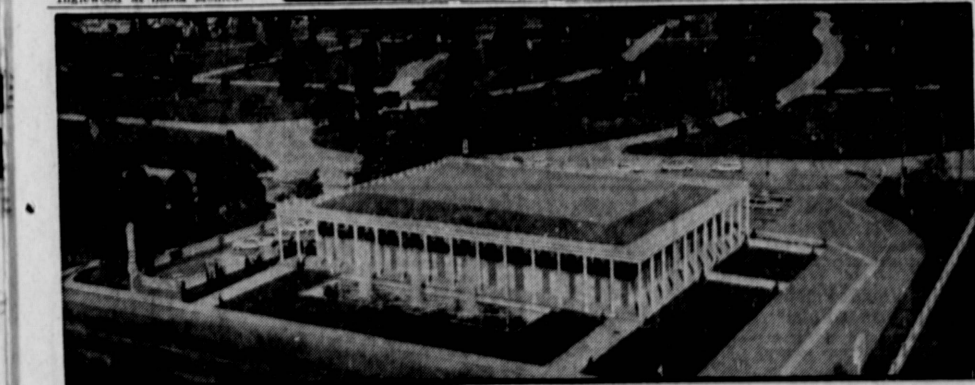
