cent of the population, has been accounting for more than 40 per cent of the disease cases reported in the county. Hospital care for most of the residents in this miles south, or at County General Hospital, 10 miles north.

This newspaper joins with the Board of Superin urging strong support for Proposition A, the Hospital Bond Issue, on the June 7 ballot.
