Faced with the problem of a cracked ceiling, the owners of a home found a "bold" solution.

They didn't want to go through the mess and delay of re-plastering the old ceiling. And they wanted decorative quality in keeping with the home's decor.

After looking at dozens of ceiling tile patterns they chose a noncombustible mineral fiber tile with high acoustical value. They liked the "bold" three dimensional ceiling pattern with its appearance of a continuous surface. They also enjoy having face. They also enjoy having a modern sound absorbing ceiling that blends with and enhances the character of the early American furnishings.

Because the old ceiling, though cracked, was still quite sound the tile was installed directly to the ceiling with adhesive. The job was finished in one day.

The owners are particularly pleased that in years to come they may paint their new ceilings and not normally reduce the sound-absorbing qualities. The Celotes Corp., manufacturer of the tile selected, called "Riviera," recommends that a good grade of interior finish paint applied in a thin coat -

If necessary, the tile may be periodically washed with a damp sponge, or cleaned with a chemically-treated syn-thetic sponga.

These enlightening facts re-These enlightening facts resulted from a recent national survey conducted for the National Association of Mirror Manufacturers by the Meredith Publishing Company with the cooperation of Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company.

Nearly all queried on mirror purchase indicated they preferred larger mirrors for the reasons that they make small rooms appear larger,

they tend to make a room warmer in appearance be-cause of light reflecting qualities, and they tend to brighten a room more than pictures.

In answer to the query of where mirrors do their best work in improving the ap-pearance of a room, the order pearance of a room, the order of preference was first in the living room, then the bath-room, the bedroom, the dining room and lastly the hall and family room. This is evidence that mirrors are gaining in importance as a basic decorative and functional home accessory rather than just a personal beauty aid.

for period styling. Price was an influencing factor to ap-proximately half of the sur-veyed group. But mirror manufacturers are aware from current trends that all mirror purchases expect quality mirror glass in a broad range of styles for many different settings.
