

# Federal Agency to Apply Sanctions Against LSD

According to Time, an estimated 10,000 students in the University of California system have tried LSD. The problem is of such magnitude that the state Attorney General has called for conferences with university officials, medical personnel, and law enforcement officers. Students seeking the "trip" provided by a minute dosage of LSD and similar "consciousness-expanding" agents are not only from colleges and

universities: In California at least use of LSD has struck at preparatory and public high schools.

Hard-core narcotics — opium, heroin, cocaine, morphine — still present a major problem to law-enforcement officials and to those who fall victim either to addiction or to the crimes committed by addicts. But drugs called hallucinogens, such as LSD, present a new and growing threat to public health and safety. Although nonaddictive in a physiological sense, the hallucinogens can be more harmful than "conventional" narcotics.

Use of these drugs, particularly of LSD, among students and campus fringe-groups has increased alarmingly both in large, cosmopolitan universities and in small liberal arts schools. Some areas even have cults of users.

MANY DEVOTEES of the current LSD fad simply do not understand the personal consequences of the use of LSD. Disorientation from small doses can have results ranging from temporary but

severe emotional illness to bizarrely distorted reality, through suicide or permanent psychosis. Impaired perception can make a user believe he is able to fly or to walk into speeding traffic with impunity. People who have had personal experience with LSD find it impossible precisely to describe the world they have entered.

But whatever the unknown world may be, it is vivid and often terrifying. It is usually an eight-hour venture into nightmare-like exploding colors and strange shapes and

of the drug partially accounts for its rapid spread.

FULL SANCTIONS for illegal sale and manufacture of LSD will be imposed in mid-May by the Food and Drug Administration. Considering the consequences to drug users and to those who may come into contact with them, the legal penalties seem light. The maximum sentence for repeated offenders can be no more than six years imprisonment with a possible fine of not more than \$15,000. Specialization is needed.

agents are now being trained in investigatory and detection techniques.

An educational campaign is also being waged. Letters stressing the dangers of LSD were sent on April 5 to 2,000 college and university officials by FDA Commissioner Dr. James Goddard.

Whether the new penalties and the current educational campaign will be effective deterrents remains to be seen. The next few months will tell whether even stronger liges-

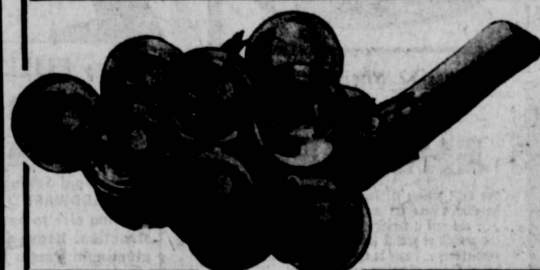

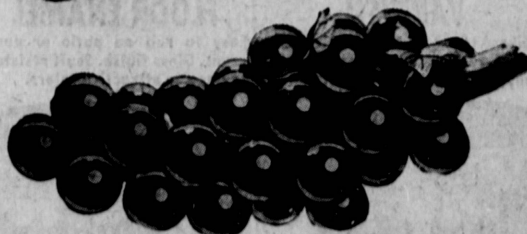
