Scout Show Slated at El Camino

Five special program areas will vie for attention with 300 booths at the Scout-O-Rama '66, to be held Saturday, May 21, at El Camino College.

Bryan Harkwick, chairman for the Scout-O-Rama, said 300 troops, packs, and posts in the South Bay and Harbor districts are preparing for demonstrations and displays in the 300 booths.

Scouting skills, Cub Scout games and crafts, and Explorer Post specialties will be featured at each of the booths. Audience participation will be invited at each booth.

TICKETS FOR the show may be purchased from all Cubs, Scouts, and Explorers for \$1 each, according to Charles Nollenberger, ticket chairman.
