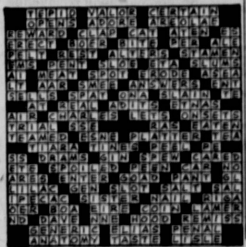
Four Area Youths Win In Contest

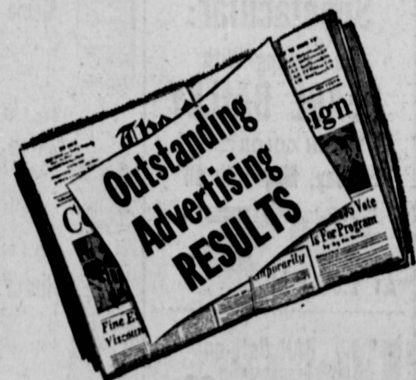
