Replies to questionnaires sent to all candidates for governor, lieutenant governor, controller, secretary of state, attorney general, treasurer, and superintendent of public instruction have been reprinted in the candidates' own words by the League of Women

Voters of California. Duties of each of the contested offices are also outlined.

County candidates replying to the questionnaire compiled by the League of Women Voters of Los Angeles County were those seeking the offices of sheriff, assessor, supervisor, and judge. Background information and pro and con arguments on the two county ballot measures are also included in the county publication.

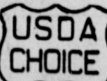
