

Cinema Consultant to Address Harbor Area Advisory Council

"Possibilities in TV for the Young Child," will be the topic of a talk given by Dr. Lester Beck, consultant in cinema to the Oregon Division of Higher Education and the U. S. Office of Education, at the annual dinner meeting of the Harbor Area Advisory Council of Family Service of Los Angeles, 6:30 p.m., Friday at St. Mark's Presbyterian Church, 24027 Pennsylvania Ave., Lomita.

The Rev. John V. Worthington, advisory board chairman, who is assistant minister of St. Peters By the Sea Presbyterian Church in Portuguese Bend, pointed out that "television and its affect on young children is of great interest to parents today."

HIGHLIGHT of Dr. Beck's presentation will be the showing of films just received from Washington, D.C., that picture groups of underprivileged pre-school children and their spontaneous reactions to various types of television programs.

Child development is the special concern of Dr. Beck, along with new instructional methods for the improvement of teaching. He has done a good deal of contact work for the U. S. Office of Education, and for the past year has been working on a special pilot project involving 120 college professors.

Dr. Beck believes that two groups at the opposite ends of the educational spectrum—those teaching the child from one to six years and the college professors—have not been given help in understanding the "theory of learning in relation to teaching methods."

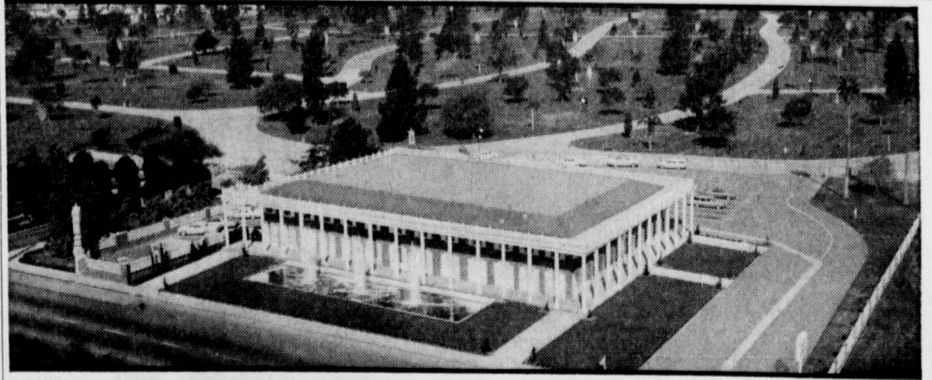
