

Scout Camps to Bring Outdoors to 600 Girls

The South Bay Council of Girl Scouts will hold three established camps this summer with 200 girls at each session. All girls of fourth grade level and above are eligible. Girl Scout membership is not a requirement.

Big Bear Lake Camp will be in session from June 28 through July 9, and July 9 through July 18; while the de Benneville Pines Camp in Barton Flats will be held Aug. 9 through 20.

Campers may apply for more than one session. Transportation by bus is provided from the Morris Scout House in Redondo Beach.

THE CAMP fee includes all living expenses plus transportation, program activities and instruction. Camp scholarships are available to assist girls in paying the camp fee.

Waterfront activities both include canoeing, boating and swimming, outdoor adventures in nature, conservation and a primitive campout on a backpacking trip.

Sports include archery, volleyball and swimming at both sites have large pools. For qualified Cadettes, a canoe exploration trip is a special adventure at Big Bear Camp, while an overnight backpack on Mount San Geronimo is offered at de Benneville Pines. An overnight trail ride is scheduled for qualified riders at de Benneville, an added attraction for horse lovers.
