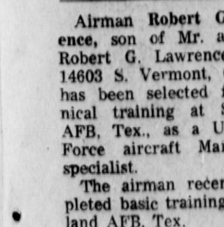
**ALBERT A. ANDREWS**

owners and possessors of dairy herds and other bovine animals have had ten years to remove same from the City, which period is sufficient for the amortization of their investments therein.

**SECTION 2.**  
That this City Council does hereby declare that the maintenance of cows (both dry and milking), calves, bulls, steers or any other type of bovine animal is a public nuisance and that the public health, safety and welfare requires the immediate removal of said animals from the City.

**SECTION 3.**  
That article VII entitled Bovine Animals is hereby added to Chapter 4 of "The Code of the City of Torrance 1964" as follows:

Article VII. Bovine Animals

Sec. 4.70. Maintenance of bovine animals prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person as principal agent, employee or otherwise to maintain or cause or permit to be maintained or kept on any premises in the City any bulls, steers, calves (both dry and milking) or any bovine animal of the City.

**SECTION 4.**  
It is not the intent of this City Council in adopting this ordinance to repeal or otherwise modify the provisions of Section 17 of Appendix I of this Code. (The Land Use Ordinance).

**SECTION 5.**  
Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or six (6) months in the County Jail or both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Press-Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, California.
