Contest winners, to be chosen by audience applause, will receive valuable toy and food prizes given by Swift in addition to seeing themselves on television.

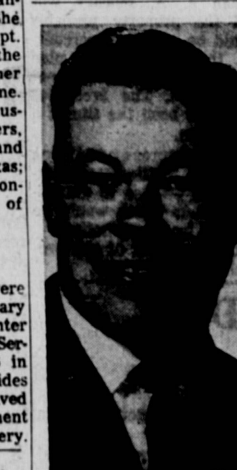
Contest registration and preliminary judging will be held at the circus an hour before the morning performance.
