Applications for life insurance under the home protection plan of the Department of Veterans Affairs are being mailed out with the June, I statements to California veterans who are aged 65 or older and who are purchasing their homes or farms with a Cal-Vet loan.

State Director of Veterans Affairs Joseph M. Farber announced last month that the older California veteran would become eligible for the insurance on June 1. He estimates that about 2,000 will qualify immediately.

Farber pointed out that the new coverage for persons who could otherwise be uninsurable is possible because of the Cal-Vet Farm and Home Program.
