Summer Day 'Slasher' Prompts More Camp Formed Intensive Stable Patrol

A summer day camp is being formed for all children of the South Bay Area between the ages of five and a half and twelve, announces Temple Menorah of Redondo Beach. The camp will be directed by professional counselors who have planned a varied program including swimming lessons, sports, arts, crafts, nature lore, music, dramatics and dancing. There will also be field trips, cookouts and overnight camp-outs.

There will be two sessions of four weeks each, five days a week. The first session is from July 11 through August 5, and the second runs from August 8 through September 2.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has requested the County Sheriff to intensify patrol near stables in the Dominguez and Palos Verdes Peninsula area because of the recent outbreak of horses being injured by a "slasher."

"It disturbs me greatly to read in the newspapers of horses being slashed and cut at night," Hahn said. "Any person who would cut a horse or other defenseless animal should be locked up."

Hahn said that in some cases the Sheriff's patrol cars

will actually drive on the grounds of stables and riding clubs.

He acted upon the request of Carl Hoffman, president of the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce, who reported to him this week that seven horses were slashed at the Dominguez Riding Club at 195th Street and Main.
