heartfelt sighs of relief from most of us. There is something spiritually frustrating about long weeks of comparative nonproductivity on major issues. Yet each of us, regardless of the particular bloc with which he is affiliated, has gained strength by sticking to his principles rather than by apathetically voting just to bring about adjournment.

The issues which continue to divide our two houses are so fundamentally important to the well-being of our state that they should not be decided on the basis of mere political expediency. Deep and earnest consideration must be given to their long-range impact on our ability to continue our economic and social progress. But, as one of

our leaders commented, the recess until after the election will give all of us an opportunity to relax after that fateful day, and perhaps refresh our willingness to work for acceptable compromises.

THE MAJOR problem which still blocks settlement of the remaining important matters is that of constitutional revision, and legislation needed to implement it. As I have written previously, the assembly has passed and sent to the senate a proposed constitutional amendment. The most significant of its provisions would provide for annual general sessions of the legislature, and for the setting of legislative salaries by statutory enactment, rather than by constitutional limitation.

The legislation accompanying the amendment, which proposes to set up stiff standards to control conflicts of interest between the public responsibilities and the private affairs of legislators, proved to be the hard core of the dispute between our two houses. In hearings held by the Senate Governmental Efficiency Committee, the assembly version of this important provision was strongly attacked by several senators, and the bill and amendment were tied up.

THE ASSEMBLY, which strongly favors the constitutional revision package, retaliated by shelving both the \$4.6 billion budget bill, and the tax accrual bill which is necessary to balance it, and there they will sit until we return

from our recess. As I have written before, some kind of a budget bill must be passed in time to be signed by midnight June 30, if our state operating a the new fiscal year.

The local property assessment reform bill is still held in the State Revenue and Taxation Committee. Hearings on it, of course, not be resumed until after the recess. It is expected that the measure will continue to have trouble in getting out of the senate.

How long we will continue in session after the recess is a matter for general conjecture. Some indication of what could happen came when one assembly leader announced that he is cancelling a planned summer European tour.
