Traveling Science Show Scheduled by Phone Firm

Free long distance phone calls, displays and exhibits of communications gear from the past, present and future plus the world's tic-tac-toe champion add up to one thing. Pacific Telephone's Telefair which opens Thursday in the Rolling Hills Plaza Shopping Center.

Sponsored by the Torrance community relations activity team of Pacific Telephone, Telefair will run Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Hours are 12 noon to 9 p.m. and admission is free to adults and children.

TELEFAIR, reminiscent of an old-fashioned carnival, is a traveling science show complete with a colorful red and white striped tent and barker.

The barker will encourage customers to enter the tent where telephone employees in red and white vests, black ties and straw hats will be on hand to explain and demonstrate the goings-on.

Need to Borrow Money? You Have to Pay for It

If you need to borrow money, there is certainly going to be a charge for it. Interest rates are usually based on the amount of security for the money requested.

The \$64 question which should be asked, when borrowing money, is how is the interest computed?

If you are the average person, you are buying your home and car on a time payment plan. Let's assume your loan on your home is with a savings and loan, and the interest rate is 7 per cent. Your car is financed with your local bank at 7 per cent interest. Would you believe you are paying approximately twice as much interest to the

bank for your car as you are paying for your home?

That's right, let's compute it. In order to show a comparison let's use equal figures, of course keeping in mind your house loan would be considerably greater in most cases. If you financed \$3,000 for three years at 7 per cent interest, your banker would multiply 7 per cent times \$3,000, which equals \$210 per year. Since you want the money for three years, you then must multiply \$210 by three, which equals your total interest of \$630. Now add your interest to the \$3,000 borrowed, and divide by 36 to get your monthly payments. In this case your payments would be \$100.89 per month.

A real estate loan is computed differently, each month you multiply 7 per cent times the unpaid balance, then divide by twelve to find your interest charge. You will only be paying interest on money

you owe, and not on what you have already paid back. A \$3,000 real estate loan for three years, at 7 per cent, would amortize out at \$92.64 per month. A saving of \$8.25 per month or a total savings of \$297, almost 5 per cent less than your bank loan for your car.

Many people are not aware of the pitfalls in computing interest. This is only one example and many, many more could be illustrated.

I have seen situations in retail stores, where interest costs were 400 per cent greater than the two common ways I have shown. Beware of the low interest rate come-on. Know what your money is costing you to borrow it.

Interest on a real estate loan is mighty low compared to all other ways to borrow money. Remember the interest rate is of minor importance, compared to how the rate is computed.

If you already own a home, check with your realtor before making any large purchases. He might save you many dollars, and put you in the lending business, if your equity is large enough.
