Lame-Duck Senate Finishing Work in Sacramento

Because of reapportionment, for the first time all 40 Senate seats were up in a single election. The effect of the changes is to shift seats from the north and middle sections of the state to the populous south. The area north of the Tehachapis, which previously had 32 seats, has been reduced to 18 districts. The other 14 seats have been assigned to counties in the south, thus giving them numerical control of the Senate.

The consolidation of northern districts into larger areas forced many veteran Senators either to retire, or to run against colleagues of their own parties in the primaries.
The losers must continue to serve for the remainders of their terms, which expire the first of the year. Obviously, this situation is not particularly conducive to happiness. What effect it will have on What effect it will have on the important legislation still facing us remains to be seen.

THE KEY to our legislative blockade is still constitutional revision and the conflict-of-interest bill. Not until these issues are settled will we be able to act on the 1966-67 budget bill or the tax accrual bill, both of which must be
