Hospital Board Names Officers

Mrs. Boris S. Woolley has been re-elected president of the Torrance Memorial Hospital Board of Directors, following the board's annual organization meeting here.

Serving with Mrs. Woolley will be George Post, manager of United California Bank's Torrance office, as vice president; Dean L. Sears, a retired banker, as secretary; Mrs. Charles A. Curtiss, a housewife of 1321 Engracia Ave., as assistant secretary, and Philip M. Halloran, M.D., as treasurer.

Board members re-elected at the meeting include Mrs. Paul Loranger, 1446 Post Ave.; Henry W. Creeger, retired manager of the American Radiator Standard Sanitary Corp.; Judge Donald Armstrong of the South Bay Municipal Court, and Dr. Halloran and Mrs. Woolley.

By-laws of the association, which was established in 1921 by Jared S. Torrance, provide for a 15-member board. Three members must be physicians, five must be women, and seven must be men who are not doctors of medicine. Directors serve three-year terms. Officers of the board are elected annually.

Tridair Buys New Site Here

Tridair Industries today announced the acquisition of a 20-acre site near the Torrance Municipal Airport for an expansion program. The company plans to construct a 62,000 sq. ft. factory for Calfax, Inc., specialists in the design and production of precision fasteners for the aerospace and electronics industries. Cost of the structure is estimated at \$500,000. The Calfax structure will be ready for occupancy in December, according to Milton A. Miner, president of Tridair.

The balance of the property will be used for ultimate development of a factory complex. The development will provide added space for the Brownline Corp., specialists in air cargo restraint equipment and systems, and the largest unit in the Tridair group. Tridair corporate headquarters will remain in Redondo Beach.

Modernization and expansion programs at the headquarters site have been completed, and Brownline is now operating facilities on Compton Boulevard adjacent to the San Diego Freeway.

Architectural and site development studies for Tridair's expansion program were provided by Robert Clements and Associates, prominent Los Angeles firm of architects, engineers, and planners.

Jonas, Goodlick and Associates acted as realtors in the \$870,000 land transaction.
