Policewoman to Live in Philippines

Mrs. Maxine Hahn, a policewoman with the Torrance Police Department for the past 13 years, resigned today. She will sail July 7 aboard the American President Liner SS Cleveland from San Francisco to make her home in Manila, The Philippines.

In January of this year, her husband, John P. Hahn, formerly with the Torrance Police Dept., became a public safety advisor with the Foreign Services Division of the State Department and is now assigned to the American Embassy, Saigon, Viet Nam. The state department is sending Mrs. Hahn and 16-year-old daughter, Cheryl, to Manila and once a month Mr. Hahn will visit his family.

Policewoman Hahn joined the local department in 1953 when there were only two other women on the force. She was assigned to the afternoon shift for four years and during that time she graduated from El Camino College and continued at Long Beach State College, majoring in police science. She now holds an advance certificate with Police Officers Standards and Training with the State of California.

Mrs. Hahn has been active in many local and state organizations. She wears the pin of past president of the Torrance Business and Professional Women's Club; past president of Harbor Section, Sierra Mar district B&PW; past president of the Los Angeles County Women's Peace Officers Assn.; and has resigned as second vice president of the Women's Peace Officers Assn., State of California. The local women is a charter member of the Little Company of Mary Hospital Auxiliary and has served on the Board of Directors of the Torrance Police Officers Assn.

She plans to continue work in the Philippines on her credentials for teaching police science.

Members of the Torrance B&PW club honored her at a surprise farewell party on June 6 and members of the police department will say farewell at an informal party on Sunday June 26.
