

# School Aide to Attend Conference on Guidance

Dr. Louis Kaplan, assistant superintendent of special services in the Torrance schools, has been invited to participate in the fourth annual Harvard Institute for administrators of pupil personnel services.

He is one of 65 top-level participants in the invitational conference scheduled for July 17 through 29 at Harvard University.

Leaders in guidance and pupil personnel throughout the nation will probe the topic, "Guidance in American Education: Changes and Choices."

Participants will examine influence of government, business and industry, foundations, non-profit corporations, university scholars and teacher organizations on educational changes.

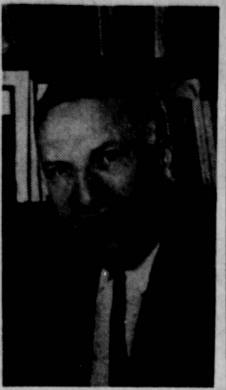

William Jones, 1720 Carbrillo Ave., sustained severe head injuries in the crash, which occurred at 190th Street and Hawthorne Boulevard. He is in the intensive care unit at Harbor General Hospital.

Jones told police he was traveling west on 190th Street and missed a curve as he approached Hawthorne Boulevard. The car went out of control and overturned.

The injured man was taken to Little Company of Mary Hospital for treatment, then transferred to Harbor General.

## Minor Damage Reported in Refinery Fire

A spectacular fire, ignited when flammable gas escaped from a valve at the Mobile Oil Co. refinery here Sunday, did only minor damage.

Firemen said the gas escaped early Sunday, ignited, and engulfed a 20-story tower in flames. The valve was closed and only burning insulation was left, firemen reported.

The blaze, which could be seen for several miles, was controlled in less than an hour by Torrance firemen who worked under the direction of battalion chief Ray Flagg.

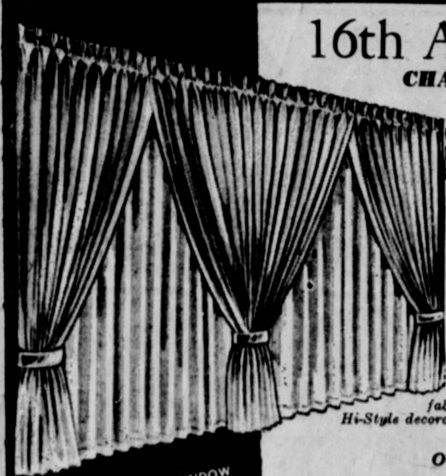
