might well succumb to its blandishments. Abundance describes the state of the nectarine crop in California this summer. The weather has worked hand-in-hand with growers, and the results are glowing. Quantity and quality of the fruit is outstanding.

NECTARINE NUT SQUARES 2 to 4 fresh nectarines 4 lb. butter or margarine 5 cup granulated sugar

eggs tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. vanilia 1 cup sifted all-purpose flour 1 tsp. baking powder % tsp. salt 1 cup brown sugar % cup roasted diced almonds

12 mint sprigs Coarsely chop enough nec-tarines to make 1 cup. Cream butter and granu-lated sugar; beat in 2 eggs and ½ tsp. vanilla. Sift % cup flour, ½ tsp. baking powder and ¼ tsp. sait; blend into butter mix-ture until soft and smooth. Spread dough into greased 13x0x2-inch baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees 10 min-utes.

Manwhile, beat remain-man eggs with brown sugar until fluffy. Sift remaining flut, baking powder and salt; stir into egg mix-ture. Add remaining vanil-ia; fold in chopped nectar-tnes, almonds and coconut. Spread mixture over baked layer while it is still obt. Return to oven; bake about 30 minutes. Cool in pan on rack.
