

## Mother and Baby Care Class Set

Mother and Baby Care, a Red Cross preparedness training course for expectant and adoptive parents, will be given at five area locations during July.

Each course consists of seven lessons taught by a specially trained registered nurse who will instruct prospective parents on what a well dressed baby must have and what the mother should wear, eat, and do during pregnancy to insure her own and her baby's health and safety.

The nurse instructor describes the process of labor

and delivery and discusses the baby's care during his all important first year—including what to do when baby cries, a bath demonstration and practice how to hold a baby, how to be a quick-change artist and how to breast feed a new baby.

At the southwestern Red Cross District Service Center, 279 W. Beach St., Inglewood, Monday and Wednesday classes also begin tonight, but the class will meet from 7 to 9 p.m.

TUESDAY AND Thursday classes from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. are scheduled at the South Bay Red Cross classroom, 1162 Hermosa Ave., Hermosa Beach, and at the Westchester Health Center, 9100 Sepulveda Eastway, beginning next Tuesday.

## Chapel Theatre to Stage 'Virginia Woolf' July 20

After waiting for more than a year for permission to produce it, Chapel Theatre is preparing to bring Edward Albee's "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?" to Torrance.

Critics have hailed the play as a "moving, moral experience" and called "Virginia Woolf" either the greatest play of our generation or the greatest play of the century. Few modern plays have caused the sensation which accompanied the New York opening of "Virginia Woolf" in 1962.

Two members of the Pulitzer Awards Committee resigned in protest when author Albee was not accorded the Pulitzer Prize after the New York opening. The film, just released, has been called a theatre milestone and compared in importance to the invention of sound in motion pictures.

IN ORDER for Chapel Theatre to obtain permission for the production, an agreement was made that nothing will be altered or deleted from the author's script. There, this production will be presented for adults only. No one under 18 years of age

will be permitted in the auditorium.

The Chapel Theatre production of "Virginia Woolf" will be directed by Lou Bruhnke of Hermosa Beach. He has directed and acted at Chapel in such plays as "Rose Tattoo" and "Volpone" and has appeared in "Becket."

The cast includes Margaret Middleton of Redondo Beach as Martha. She appeared in "Madwoman of Chaillot" and received the best dramatic actress award for her performance. She has appeared in "Invitation to a March" this season. Roger Elliott of Hermosa Beach will portray Martha's husband George. He directed and appeared in "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" this season at Chapel.

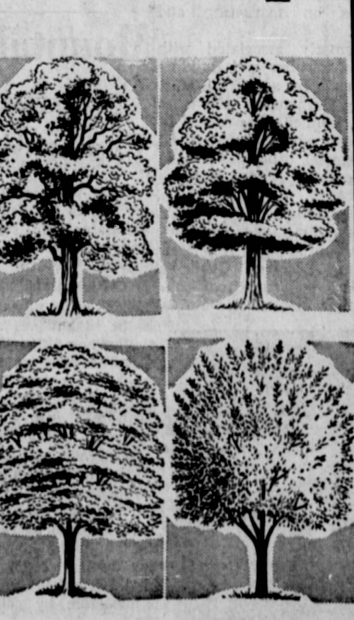
