Library Plans Films Saturday

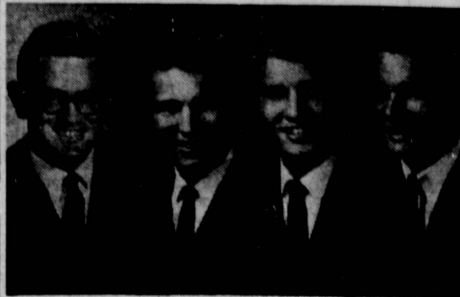
Two free films will be presented Saturday at the main Torrance Library, 1345 Post Ave. The show will begin at 10:30 a.m.
