To Head United Crusade

San Pedro Man to Head United Crusade Effort

Paul A. Vanderpool of San Pedro has been named Harbor area chairman for the 1966 United Crusade campaign, due to get under way this fall. Vanderpool served as vice chairman last year.

He has been associated with Pacific Telephone Co. for the past 10 years.

Vanderpool will direct the United Crusade's campaign in Gardena, Harbor City, Lomita, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills, San Pedro, Torrance, and Wilmington. Planning sessions currently are under way at the San Pedro Service Center of the Red Cross.

THE FATHER of a 3-year-old son, Vanderpool said he is "concerned about the great need for money to support all of the United Way and American Red Cross health, youth, and family services."

A total of 244 United Way agencies and 11 chapters of the American Red Cross receive support through the annual United Crusade fund drive.

"In the Harbor Area, there are only three family counselors for a population of 470,000," Vanderpool said. "The national average is one family counselor for every 10,000 people in order to do an effective job of keeping families together."

VANDERPOOL is a member of the San Pedro Chamber of Commerce. He attended high school in Wyoming and has attended Harbor College.

City Bank Shows Gain In Earnings

City National Bank this week reported an increase of 8 per cent in net income during the first six months of 1966.

Operating earnings for the period amounted to \$1,201,000, or 75 cents per share on 1.6 million outstanding shares. Earnings for the same period in 1965 were \$1,112,000 or 70 cents per share.

All figures have been adjusted to reflect mergers concluded during 1965. Guaranty Bank of Torrance and two other independent banks were merged with City National Bank in 1965.

Total resources amounted to \$287,963,000, compared to \$281,785,000 in 1965. Total loans amounted to \$184,261,000 as against \$180,104,000 last year, while deposits were \$251,752,000, compared to \$246,642,000 on June 30, 1965.
