County swimming pools in the Southwest area are now open for summer recreation for all residents, particularly youngsters, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said today.

"The programs at the pools provide not only recreation for youngsters, but they will be able to learn the elements of water safety under careful supervision," he said.

Recreational swimming is open at all pools each day from 1 to 5 p.m. and at many pools on some evenings. Lessons are available weekdays from 9 a.m. until noon.

Hahn pointed out free swimming is provided on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon.
