'Fancy' Vote Machines Opposed by Supervisor

Opposition to the proposed purchase of vote counting machines has been voiced by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn. Hahn said he was against spending from \$6 to \$12 million for the machines and called instead for streamlining of the existing system of counting ballots.

"The taxpayers are already overloaded and should not be asked to bear the expense of fancy machinery which would be used only one or two days a year," he declared.

MANY ESSENTIAL facilities are needed in the county — schools, hospitals, and parks—where money is more needed for the good of all citizens, the supervisor said.

Hahn said the lag in obtaining ballot results can be cut by streamlining existing systems. He has asked John Leach, assistant county administrative officer, and Benjamin Hite, registrar of voters, to report on a proposal to set up regional centers where returns could be rushed for quick tallying.

These centers would be in

schools, city halls and other public buildings and would eliminate the necessity of every precinct having to deliver their returns to voter headquarters in downtown Los Angeles.

Hahn SAID each of the five supervisorial districts should have at least three such regional centers to serve as the collection and tallying point for surrounding precincts.

"In such areas as the San Gabriel and San Fernando Valleys," he added, "there may be as many as five regional centers."

Hahn has called for initiation of this system for the November General Election. By utilizing it, he expects that the citizens will have the election results by midnight and final unofficial returns by 7 a.m. the next morning—12 hours after the polls close.

"Although television and radio have created a demand for 'instant results' I am sure the average voter will not mind waiting until midnight or the next morning for re-

turns if the alternative is spending millions of dollars for electronic devices."

HAHN POINTED out the county's first experience with voting machines was when the Board of Supervisors over his objections, "shelled out" \$900,000 in research and development costs for a vote-counting machine in 1958.

He said at the time these machines would be the biggest "lemon" in local government.

After reposing in a county basement for months, the rights to the voting machine were sold to Coleman Engineering, which agreed to reimburse the county \$500,000 over a period of years as it perfected the system and put it into use around the state.

"The \$500,000 would be made up of five per cent of the royalties as Coleman sold the vote tallying machines."

THUS FAR, a total of \$183,050 has been returned to the county. This has come from sales in Orange County, Contra Costa County, Kern County, and Multnomah County, Oregon.

"At the rate of return so far, Los Angeles may have to wait until 1990 before the \$500,000 is paid back," Hahn said.

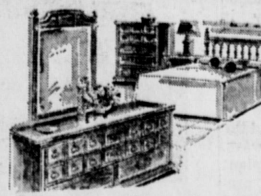

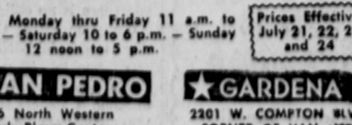
