The new board president, a member of the El Camino board since January, 1964, succeeds Seymour Rayer of Inglewood, who will continue as a trustee.

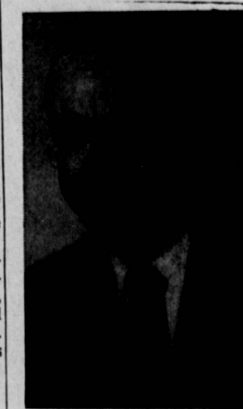

A NATIVE of Garden City, Mo., Leadbetter currently resides at 4374-F W. 132nd St., Hawthorne. He and his wife, Delores, have one daughter, Mrs. David A. Tilton.

Active in community affairs, Leadbetter is a member of the Hawthorne Chamber of Commerce and is active in the Centinela Valley YMCA, having served as a member of the board of directors of that organization. He is also a member of the Christian Church and the Elks. He is a past president of the Hawthorne Rotary Club.

FROM 1942 to 1953 Leadbetter served as assistant general manager of Northrop Aeronautics Institute, Inc., in Hawthorne. In 1954 he became president of Associated Aero Science Laboratories, Inc., his current executive capacity.

## Home Show Model Now Under Way

Construction of "Casa Lindero," Balanced Power model home for the 1966 Los Angeles Home Show slated Aug. 26 through Sept. 5 at the Pan Pacific Auditorium, has reached the framing stage and is progressing according to schedule.

Casa Lindero, the seventh Balanced Power Home Show model to be built by the R. A. Watt Co., is a deluxe duplex residence which reflects the flavor of early California. Sponsored by the Southern California and Southern Counties Gas Cos., the gas air conditioned homes reflect every convenience that is a part of indoor-outdoor living in the Southland.

THE TWIN residence consists of a 1,932 square foot tri-level plan with three bedrooms and two baths, adjoining a 1,396 square foot one-story home, also with three bedrooms and two baths.

Phil Blair, designer of the gas air conditioned homes, carries out the early California theme with an old world fountain set in a colorful open courtyard. An adobe brick planter wall affords privacy from the outside world.

Every built-in convenience is contained in the Balanced Power Kitchens, which feature modern gas range and oven, dishwasher and a pantry connected to the separate service porch. A luminous ceiling highlights the work-saving kitchen, which is separated from the family room by the snack bar.

AN INFORMAL stage for entertaining is set by the snack bar and exposed beams in the family room with sliding glass doors to the outside. Highlighting the tri-level model is the spacious master bedroom loft overlooking the sunken living room. Included in the master suite are an adjoining bath, 15 feet of wardrobe space, and a full-length pullman with double wash basins in front of a full length mirror.
