

Brother of Slain Doctor Plans Trip to the Congo

Dr. Dwight Carlson, brother of the late Dr. Paul Carlson and a resident at Harbor General Hospital, will leave this area Saturday to travel to the Congo.

Dr. Carlson will be searching for a site to establish a medical center in memory of his late brother, the Press-Herald was told yesterday.

Dr. Paul Carlson was slain by Congolese rebels in November, 1964. He had remained in the northern Congo after sending his wife and family out of the area and was subsequently captured by rebels.

He was slain moments before Belgian paratroopers landed in Stanleyville, the Congo, and freed the city.

The medical center to be established in the Congo is a project of the Dr. Paul Carlson Foundation, the Press-Herald was told.

(Continued from Page 1) the proposal "to find out how the people feel." He contends purchase is possible without significant outlays by the city. Financing through revenue bonds is possible, Isen said, without increasing water bills now paid by customers of the two companies.

The mayor said he was not proposing an immediate expenditure—an estimated \$150,000 would be required to determine if purchase is feasible—but wanted to find out what support the proposal would have before committing funds for a survey.

Urban Renewal Conference

City Delegation Sets Trip to San Francisco

Fourteen city officials will travel to San Francisco Friday for an all-day conference with federal officials on the city's urban renewal project. The city delegation, to be headed by Mayor Albert Isen and City Manager Edward J. Ferraro, will meet with officials of the Housing and Home Finance Agency (HHFA) to discuss federal and local obligations under the urban renewal program.

The city last Wednesday submitted its Part I application, which includes a request for funds to finance the project, which involves property at the west end of the Torrance Municipal Airport.

tion conference, according to Jerome I. Scharfman, assistant city manager. Federal officials are expected to discuss obligations of the city with regard to the financing, timetables, and procedures for carrying out the proposed industrial park development.

Accompanying Isen and Ferraro will be City Councilmen J. A. Beasley, David K. Lyman, Ken Miller, Ross A. Sclarotta Sr., and George Vico. Others who will attend the session are City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier, Finance Director William Dunmore, and Redevelopment Agency

officials Lawrence Irwin and R. A. Wheeler.

In addition, Walter Nollac, director of public works; Charles Shartle, planning director, and Scharfman will make the trip.

SOME 59 ACRES of property are involved in the urban renewal project, officially called the Meadow Park Redevelopment Area. Plans call for the city to purchase all land in the area and develop it as an industrial park. Sites within the park would be leased to developers under terms similar to those

which have resulted in large commercial development on city-owned land to the east and south of the airport.

PUBLIC HEARINGS on the proposed development plans will be held in September, following approval of the city's application by the federal government if current timetables are met. Scharfman said the hearings will begin about five weeks after federal approval of the application.

The city expects to begin buying land in the area about the first of the year.
