Crusade Goal Set At \$21.7 Million

United Crusade volunteers will be asked to help raise a total of \$21,750,000 to support 244 United Way agencies and 11 chapters of the American Red Cross, according to Arthur M. Wood, Crusade chairman.

"This is a challenge to measure up, to meet needs by pushing the goal over the top," Wood declared. The goal is some \$1.2 million more than was raised last year and \$2,327,034 more than was contributed to the first United Crusade campaign for United Way and the Red Cross in 1964.

Wood, vice president of Sears, Roebuck and Co., was joined by Daniel J. Houghton, president of Lockheed Aircraft Co. and chairman of the Fund Raising Council of Red Cross Chapters in Los Angeles County, and by Louis B. Lundborg, board chairman of Bank of America and president of United Way, Inc., in announcing the goal.

THE MINIMUM need for the near future is \$24.9 million, Wood said, but the 1966 goal was set with the hope that it can be far exceeded. The goal can be exceeded if workers will give one hour's pay per month and salaried employees give 1 per cent of their income, he added.

Corporations and business firms will be asked to meet a pro rata share yardstick worked out by a committee of businessmen.

Pointing out that Los Angeles County ranks at the top of the 10 metropolitan areas in per capita personal in-

come—but last in per capita giving, Wood said, "Other cities meet the challenge of need and growth and I am certain that the family of cities and the tremendous volunteer organization of the United Crusade will measure up."

"UNLESS WE reduce our unmet needs with voluntary contributions dollars, these needs will exact a bitter cost in personal human tragedy, blighted lives, and underdeveloped human resources," he added.

Of particular concern, according to Houghton are increased demands put on the Red Cross because of the Viet Nam War. A minimum increase of 24 per cent in aid to servicemen and their families has been projected, he added.

Houghton also cited "an abnormal rise in disaster relief" which has exhausted Red Cross budgeted funds and "seriously depleted emergency reserves."

The United Crusade campaign is expected to begin in late September and it is hoped the goal can be achieved by mid-November, Wood said.

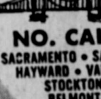

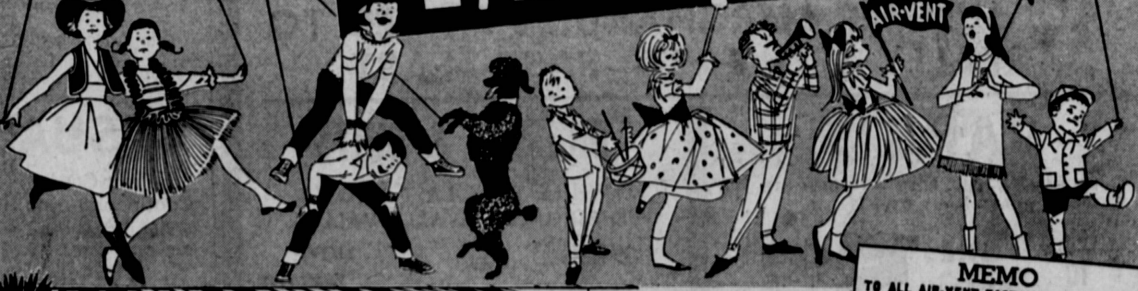
