## Councilmen Slice Up 'Fringe' Pie

Torrance Councilmen voted themselves some fringe benefits last night and made the action retroactive to Jan. 1, 1964.

Councilmen declared themselves eligible to participate in the city's employe health insurance programs on the same basis as regular city employes, which means the city will contribute a portion of the health insurance premiums.

The action followed an opinion by Richard L. Knickerbocker, senior deputy city attorney, that such payments can be made by the city since a provision of the state constitution has been suspended.

The constitutional provision prohibits such payments if they begin during the term of office of the voting members of the council, since such payments are considered additional compensation.

Attorney General Thomas Lynch has ruled that the constitutional provision is not in operation because of the Viet Nam War, Knickerbocker said.

Therefore, he added, councilmen — and City Clerk Vernon W. Coil and City Treasurer Thomas Rupert —are eligible for the health insurance program.

The Jan. 1, 1964, date was selected since it is the date set in city ordinance as the beginning of the Viet Nam War for the purpose of determining veteran's preference in civil service matters.

"It would not be as certain that the constitutional compensation limitation would be suspended prior to that date," Knickerbocker said.
